GFL Environmental offers all residents in the unincorporated areas of Brunswick County curbside recycling through a subscription program. The program provides one blue/green, 96 gallon, roll out cart and collections are made every other week. The option to sign up for this program started in July 2012. Seven municipalities in the county participate with GFL Environmental in offering their residents curbside recycling, paid through their property tax.

The biggest change to our program is the increase in price per ton. It went from \$0/ton in FY2019 to \$41/ton in FY2020 and now we are paying \$71/ton.

The pandemic has been interesting. We have seen a big increase in contaminated recycle loads especially at our non-staffed locations. Residents have been home more so there has been an increase in packaging but they have also been spring cleaning which has caused a lot of contamination.

We have not had any new ordinances in the county.
