"I have supporting documents attached for your inquires. For pesticides I also have the receipts from our household hazardous waste event however, I find the email attached is easier to read then the receipts. If you would like those as well I can provide them. So based on this information I would say our pesticide number is accurate.

Also, we have a breakdown of households in Currituck who have the option to go to a recycling drop-off. Corolla has 4,147 households who have curbside however, in addition they have the option to bring items to any of our convenience sites. So this would be a combination of 12,639 households in the mainland plus the 4,147 households from Corolla who have the option of using the convenience sites. Also, in the northern part of our county we are seeing major growth and expect these number to continue to increase."
