Since last fiscal year, Onslow County Solid Waste has re-classified our deputy director position into a landfill attendant and a recycling and community coordinator position. Our recycling and community coordinator is helping us to spread the word about proper recycling and about what solid waste offers our community through its various programs.

Onslow County Solid Waste has also undergone a change in directors with Melissa Moore leaving half way through the fiscal year.

Onslow County is anticipating that in FY 2022 we will be starting to recycle tires here at our location using a new shredder. The change to the permit request has been entered for review. Due to the high cost of the tire recycler we have decided to go in a different direction.

CA note on white goods from R. Vanover: This year I pulled what we have logged as 'shipping' to Foss which is truly the tonnage of 'white goods' collected by Onslow County. So therefore, FY 2018 should have been 778.86 tons, FY 2019 should have been reported as 1001.66 tons, and 2020 should have been 1096.32 and 2021 is 1084.88 tons.
