No separate school tons are shown on invoices from the contractor and are not included in the county report. (Past Correspondence with the staff -DH from 2017)

Question # 43 and Questions 68 through 73 - White Goods and Metals: The county collects white goods and metals but none have been brought to the county convenience center properties in the last FOUR fiscal years. A local scrap metal dealer tends to get this material according to conversations with staff. (Historical information -DH -8/29/2019)

Question #43- Missing C and D Tons: The landfill transfer station was totally flooded during the storm. Solid waste was diverted to Craven County (email from county staff on August 30, 2019 -DH)

Question # 46: Pesticide Containers: The county rarely gets pesticide containers. Local farmers that do their own spraying will bring them in to a box that is for that. (Historical information -DH -8/29/2019).

Question # 46- Used Oil volume increase: This was due to its removal prior to the storm (email from county staff on August 30, 2019 -DH)

Question # 50- No yard waste tons: The county has discontinued collecting yard waste due to space issues at the landfill -transfer station and the cost of managing it email from county staff on August 30, 2019 -DH)

Question 60- Solid Waste, Recycling and Bulky Waste Charges at Drop-off: The county has a bulky waste charge of \$ 100 per ton when delivered to transfer station. For solid waste delivered in bulk to the station there is a \$ 100 charge per ton. No charge for delivering recycled
