Question # 16 -Franchised Recycling Operations: The City Of Creedmoor issued an exclusive franchise to Waste Industries, as the exclusive solid waste services provider in Creedmoor. Service with Waste Industries began in April 2015. (Correspondence with town staff over the last two years - See previous LGAR reports for more information-DH)

Question # 43- Special Event Recycling: The Creedmoor Music Festival was held on Sept. 17, 2016. Carts are brought into the streets to provide this service and all items collected by Waste Industries are reported in the total commingled recyclables and no separate tons are tracked. (DH - 10-9-2017)

Question # 45: White Goods Tons: The town gets less than 10 hauls per year for white goods. They are not charged at the landfill for disposal. Therefore, they did not report any tonnage in 2016-17 (DH -10-9-2017)

Question 51 & Question # 62: Yard Waste Final Destination and Service: Yard waste went to Granville County for management. See the Granville County LGAR for FY 2016-17 for more information.(DH note - 10-9-1017). It is a free service to residents in the town.

Question # 64, Question # 65 and Question # 66- Contract Amount and Budgets: There was no contracted amount between Waste Industries and the City of Creedmoor. Waste Industries bills its citizens directly under the franchise arrangement. There is no specific city budget for MSW Services and recycling. The city does not directly bill citizens and is not involved in tracking finances. The city does not directly budget for its Yard Waste Pickup program but from best estimates. Yard Waste is included in the Public Works Budget and the best estimate is \$ 3,000.00 (Communications with the city staff (10-09-2017-DH).

Question # 67 - Combined Budget: There is no budget for this question. Waste Industries bills homeowners directly for recycling and garbage services. The only collections the City handles and incurs cost for is yard debris. (Communications with J. Crampton at the Town of Creedmoor (10-9-2017-DH)
