# **Background**

- Discussion during the Spring 2022 Advisory Board meeting regarding criteria reviewed around the Community Involvement requirement for ESI Steward members
- Board made a motion for a larger discussion among ESI membership on the topic

#### Membership criteria includes:

- Agree to report annually and DEQ compliance check all members
- Demonstrate a mature EMS RS and S
- Demonstrate commitment to meet and go beyond compliance RS and S
- Set site-specific measurable environmental performance goals RS and S

#### Steward Criteria - continued


#### **Steward membership criteria includes:**

- Agree to mentor other ESI members
- EMS integrated into core business functions
- Set site-specific aggressive environmental performance goals within the framework of the EMS, include pollution prevention and/or process efficiency improvements.
- Have an interactive process for communicating with the local community about program activities and progress toward performance goals\*

Membership: 84% business and 16% government, military, other NGOs

- Non-business AB member concerned about making ESG themes a requirement since they have different stakeholders












