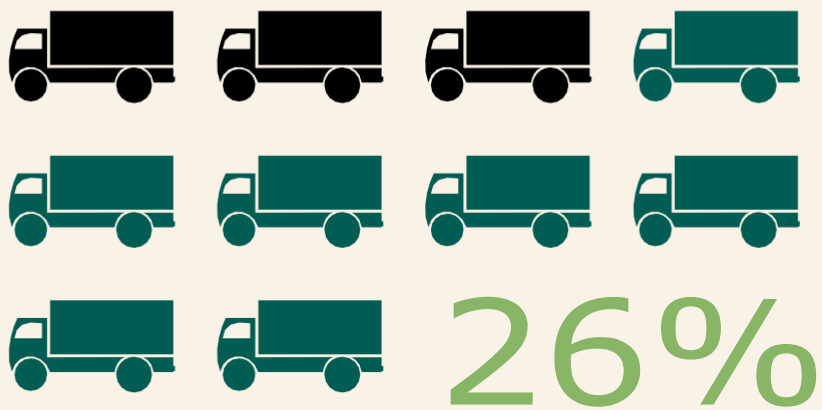


# Advanced Clean Trucks

On October 25, 2022, Governor Roy Cooper signed Executive Order 271, charging the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to begin the rulemaking process for an Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT) program. The program would require medium-and heavy-duty (MHD) vehicle manufacturers in North Carolina to sell an increasing percent of zero-emission trucks over time, starting in model year 2027.

## Why ACT?



of on road Nitrogen Oxide emissions in NC come from medium and heavy duty trucks despite making up 3.2% of cars on the road

The transportation sector makes up 36% of the state's gross greenhouse gas emissions — more than any other sector.

More clean trucks on the road will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve the air we breathe.
