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Public Notice Report

For Supplement to the Redesignation Demonstration and Maintenance Plan for the Hickory and Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point Annual PM_{2.5} Nonattainment Area

On November 15, 2010, a draft version of the North Carolina supplement to the redesignation demonstration and maintenance plan for the Hickory and Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point (referred to as the Triad area) annual fine particulate matter (PM_{2.5}) nonattainment areas was submitted to the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). A request for public hearing, in accordance with 40 CFR 51.102, and the public comment period were noticed in the local newspapers on Wednesday, November 17, 2010. The public comment period was open from November 17, 2010, through December 17, 2010. No request for public hearing was received and the public comment period elicited comments from the USEPA.

Background

The Hickory and Triad areas North Carolina, located in Catawba, Davidson, and Guilford counties, was designated nonattainment for the annual PM_{2.5} National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) on January 5, 2005 (70 Federal Register 944) and became effective on April 1, 2005. The nonattainment designation was an action taken by the USEPA under Section 107(d) of the Clean Air Act (CAA). The CAA requires that some area be designated as nonattainment if a monitor is found to be in violation of the NAAQS. The USEPA took designation action in 2005 based on the ambient data from 2001-2003. At that time, the design values for the Hickory and Triad nonattainment areas were 15.6 µg/m³ and 15.9 µg/m³, respectively.

All violating monitors were attaining the annual PM_{2.5} standard with the inclusion of the 2008 ambient data. The 2006-2008 design values for the Hickory and Triad nonattainment areas are 14.2 µg/m³ and 14.5 µg/m³, respectively. Both areas continue to attain the daily PM_{2.5} standard. Therefore, the Hickory and Triad PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas are in attainment of the annual PM_{2.5} NAAQS and eligible to be considered for redesignation to attainment. The North Carolina Division of Air Quality (NCDAQ) submitted a redesignation demonstration and maintenance plan for the Hickory and Triad PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas on December 18, 2009.

In March 2010, the USEPA announced in the Federal Register (FR) that the new mobile model, Motor Vehicle Emission Simulator (MOVES), was required for State Implementation Plan purposes and would be required for transportation conformity purposes starting March 2012 (40 FR 9411). The NCDAQ committed to the transportation partners to revise the motor vehicle emission budgets using the MOVES model. This supplement revises the on-road mobile source emissions used in the maintenance plan and the motor vehicle emission budgets which will be used for transportation conformity purposes.

Summary of Public Notice and Comment Period

The public comment period was open from November 17, 2010 through December 17, 2010. The only comments received were from the USEPA, which are attached following this report along with the NCDAQ's response to comments. Both comments received from the USEPA were not on the mobile source emissions, but rather information in the original plan submitted December 2009. The first comment will be addressed in a separate errata document while the second was a suggestion to move a rule reference from one section to another. Both comments were minor and did not impact the supplemental information being provided. The NCDAQ believes it has adequately addressed the concern in the response to comments letter.

Conclusions

The NCDAQ believes it has adequately addressed the USEPA's comments. The NCDAQ will be moving forward with the final submittal to the USEPA of the North Carolina supplement to the redesignation demonstration and maintenance plan for the Hickory and Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point annual PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas.

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**Hickory-Triad Annual Fine Particulate Matter (PM_{2.5})
Redesignation Prehearing Supplement
November 17, 2010**

State Implementation Plan (SIP) Narrative -The following comments are suggested clarifications to the submittal package.

1. The annual sulfur dioxide emission for Catawba County for 2008 in Table 3-5 is 10,978 tons per year (tpy) while Table 2-5 shows emissions of 6,174 tpy for the Marshall Steam Power plant in 2008 in Catabwa County. The Marshall Plant provides basically all emissions in this county in 2002 as presented in the attainment SIP for the Triad area. Please explain the difference between the two emissions estimates in the two tables and make the appropriate corrections to the point source inventory documentation.
2. Significant reductions in PM_{2.5} and the specific precursors are expected and achieved through the open burning ban regulation. (See Table 3-3, page 3-8) It appears that, in the Triad area, reductions of 1,774 tpy are expected in 2021. This is larger than many point source control reductions and larger than the total emissions for the Triad area in Table 3-9. While the regulation is permanent and enforceable, the state acknowledges its limited effectiveness. Based on the discussion in Appendix C.2, pages 11-13, North Carolina Department of Air Quality (NC DAQ) is projecting future reductions based on a public awareness campaign. In light of this, EPA feels that NC DAQ should consider moving the Open Burning control measure from Section 3.2.2 – *State Control Measures* to Section 3.2.3 – *Additional Programs Supporting Maintenance*.

Thank you for your letter dated December 17, 2010, transmitting the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Region 4's comments on the pre-hearing draft Supplement to the Redesignation Demonstration and Maintenance Plan for the Hickory and Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point, North Carolina annual PM_{2.5} Nonattainment Area. This letter is to provide the North Carolina Division of Air Quality's (NCDAQ's) response to those comments.

The first comment asked that NCDAQ explain why the 2008 point source sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emissions in Table 3-5 for Catawba County were 10, 978 tons per year while the Table 2-5 shows 2008 SO₂ emissions of 6,174 tons per year for Marshall Steam Plant, the largest source in Catawba County. The difference is due to the NCDAQ not having the official 2008 emissions inventory available at the time the original plan was developed and submitted, so for Table 3-5 the Clean Smokestacks Act implementation plan was used to estimate the emissions from this source, whereas the emissions from Table 2-5 were draft preliminary data from the USEPA's Clean Air Markets Division. Although the point source emissions were not part of the Supplemental package, the NCDAQ will make a correction to the Catawba County SO₂ point source emissions reflecting the actual 2008 emissions as part of an errata package.

The second comment suggested that the NCDAQ move the open burning control measures from Section 3.2.2 – State Control Measures to Section 3.2.3 – Additional Programs Supporting Maintenance, since the projecting future reductions are based on a public awareness campaign. Although this comment is out the scope of the supplemental package, the NCDAQ believes that the open burning rules are properly listed under the State Control Measures since the rule is permanent and enforceable.






