Our last pickup from Metal Recycling occurred in early April. We have been in contact with them recently for another pickup. However, it can sometimes be a month (or longer) before they are able to get to us. If we had been able to have this stockpile picked up before the end of FY 19-20, our numbers would have been much more in line with what was reported in FY 18-19.
