Notes from Catawba County: Due to the effects of COVID-19 on the daily lives of our community, there have been some fluctuations on the scale and utilization of our programs. The greatest effects have been on our public education efforts, as all in-person and community events have had to be canceled, with some moved to online platforms with varying success. There has also been marked fluctuations in the waste stream during the time in early Spring when our community was operating under quarantine measures. In April, we saw the largest increase in residential C&D waste, while MSW stayed relatively level. We also saw an increase in the general daily use of our landfill programs by residential customers, with larger loads collected overall at our permanent electronics site and at our Spring one-day HHW event, in which we collected double the average HHW and Electronics collected at previous events. It is probable that prolonged time at home led to a widespread Spring cleaning as, though we saw an average number of citizens come through our collection points, their waste loads were overall much larger and encompassed multiple households.
