# Reserve-wide Program Business (Rebecca Ellin)

#### Buxton Woods Reserve Business

Coastal Studies Institute (CSI) Student Studies – Jane Bailey, Outer Banks Field Site

A presentation was given by Jane Bailey, one of the students who worked on the capstone project "A temporal analysis of vegetation dynamics and community perceptions of Buxton Woods." The research was conducted in two ways. First, the students collected ecological and environmental data to compare vegetation changes in three plots established during the North Carolina Vegetation Survey in 1988. From the three plots, data indicated an increase in herbaceous species, a decrease in large canopy trees, and showed that overall species richness had remained relatively constant since 1988. For the second half of the study, the students interviewed Buxton residents to better understand community perceptions of the reserve. Analysis of the 11 qualitative interviews illustrated key values of recreation, sustenance, and personal well-being. Interviews also revealed perceptions of canopy loss due to storm impacts over the last 30 years. • NC Bird Atlas – Matt Janson, NC Wildlife Resources Commission (WRC)

A presentation was given by Matt Janson, the Coastal Technician that is working on WRC's North Carolina Bird Atlas. From 2021-2026, volunteers and WRC staff will be conducting bird species counts throughout the breeding and winter seasons. Two of the 937 "priority blocks" in the State overlap with the boundaries of Buxton Woods Reserve. The reserve provides critical bird habitat, and the counts will help develop an atlas which can be used for conservation planning and the analysis of bird populations in North Carolina. #### • Wildfire Management Plan Update

A contract was finalized with Bob Mickler in November to begin writing the Wildfire Management Plan for Buxton Woods. Erik Alnes met with Bob on site to familiarize him with the reserve and worked through logistics and timeframes. We plan to meet with partner agencies, starting with Natural Heritage and the Forest Service. We will be reaching out to other partner agencies in the spring to discuss larger scale fire management options to develop a cohesive plan.

## Trail Signage Update

Since last meeting, Reserve staff identified areas in need of new signage in Buxton Woods. New signs were ordered and installed. The project replaced a majority of the trail signs that had been destroyed.

## • Site Stewards Expansion Project

Plans to develop a cohesive volunteer program have begun in the Northern Sites. Later in December, the Northern Sites Manager will host a training for volunteers in Kitty Hawk Woods Reserve. The volunteer program, called the Site Stewards Volunteer Program, focuses to educate volunteers in the N.C. Coastal Reserve and National Estuarine Research Reserve System programs, and train them to maintain public access and trails, monitor site conditions, and help with community-based projects. After the pilot training in Kitty Hawk, Reserve staff plan to host an additional training for Buxton Woods in the Spring. Friends of the Reserve (FOR) supplied funding for T-shirts to provide visibility of volunteers in the field.
