It is the policy of the State to foster, improve, enhance and ensure optimum 8 9 access to the public beaches and waters of the 20 county coastal region. Access shall be consistent with rights of 10 private property owners and the concurrent need to protect important coastal natural resources such as sand dunes and 11 coastal marsh vegetation. (b) The State has created an access program for the purpose of acquiring, improving and maintaining waterfront 12 13 recreational property at frequent intervals throughout the coastal region for public access to these important public 14 trust resources. (c) In addition, some properties, due to their location, are subject to severe erosion so that development is not possible 15 or feasible. In these cases, a valid public purpose may be served by the donation or acquisition of these properties for 16 17 public access. 18 (d) The primary purpose of the public access program is to provide funds to acquire or develop land for public access, including parking as authorized by G.S. 113A 134.3(c).
