Call to Order

Rudi Rudolph called the meeting to order with 11 members in attendance.

Temporary Erosion Control Structures

Staff presented possible temporary erosion control structure rule amendments and the council began discussion. Spencer Rogers discussed the possibility of revising rule language to address material used in constructing sandbags. David Moye made a motion requesting staff to review rule language regarding sandbag construction material for the next council meeting and this motion was approved. David Moye additionally made a motion that the council recommend CRC adoption of staff's proposed temporary erosion control structures rule amendments and this motion was also approved.

Geotubes

Staff surveyed other states where geotubes have been used. Staff explained most responses received were negative and these structures overall did not perform well in high energy environments. Spencer Rogers questioned whether geotubes are allowed by law and staff explained Department counsel has advised that geotubes are considered oversized sandbags thus would require a variance to be constructed.
