Coastal Area Management Act (CAMA) of 1974

- Cooperative State-Local Program
 - Local initiative for planning
 - State supportive standard-setting and review
 - Enforcement a concurrent joint responsibility
- Land Use Plans
 - County Plan Required
 - Two-Tier ApproachAECs / Non-AECs



Coastal Resources Commission Planning Authority Under CAMA

- Approve Land Use Plans
- Prepare and Adopt a County Land Use Plan if a county chooses not to prepare and adopt a CAMA Land Use Plan

Coastal Resources Commission Planning Role Under Rules

- Certify Land Use Plans and Amendments
- Review Minor Amendments denied by the Executive Secretary
- Prepare and Adopt a County Land Use
 Plan if a county chooses not to prepare and adopt a plan that meets the planning requirements
