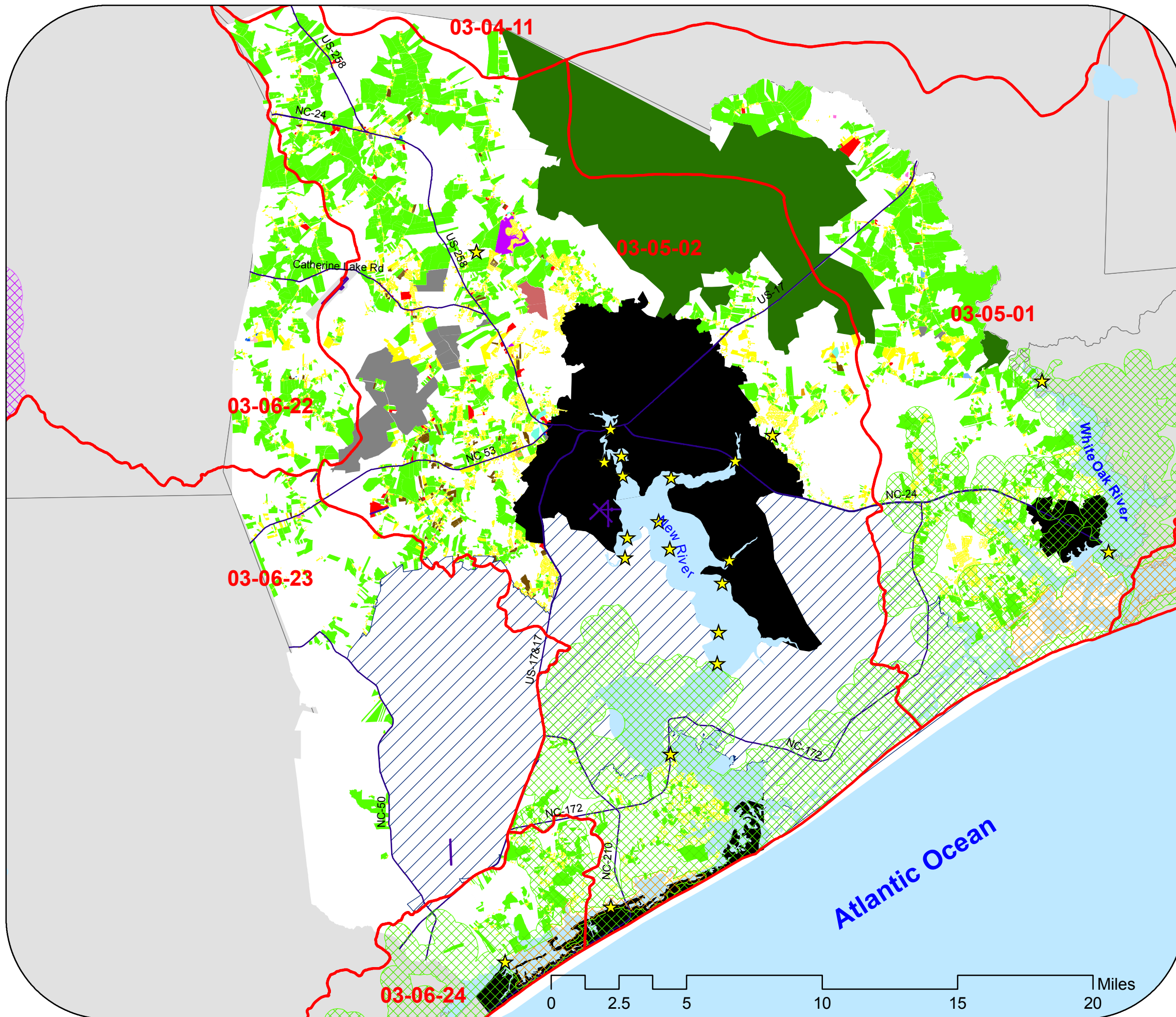


Onslow County Land Use Plan

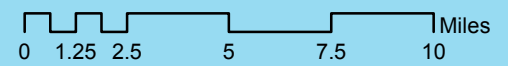

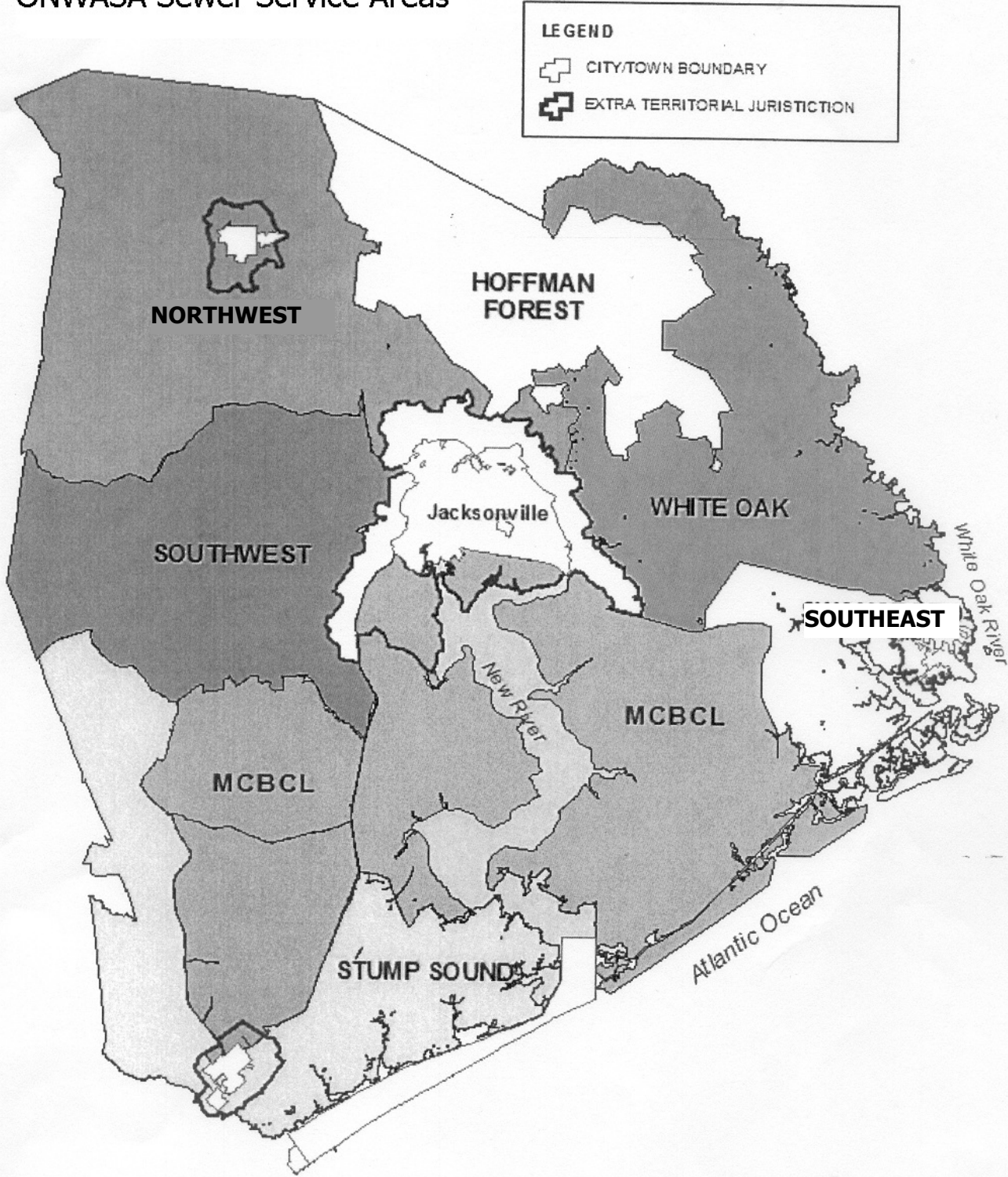

Water Service Regions



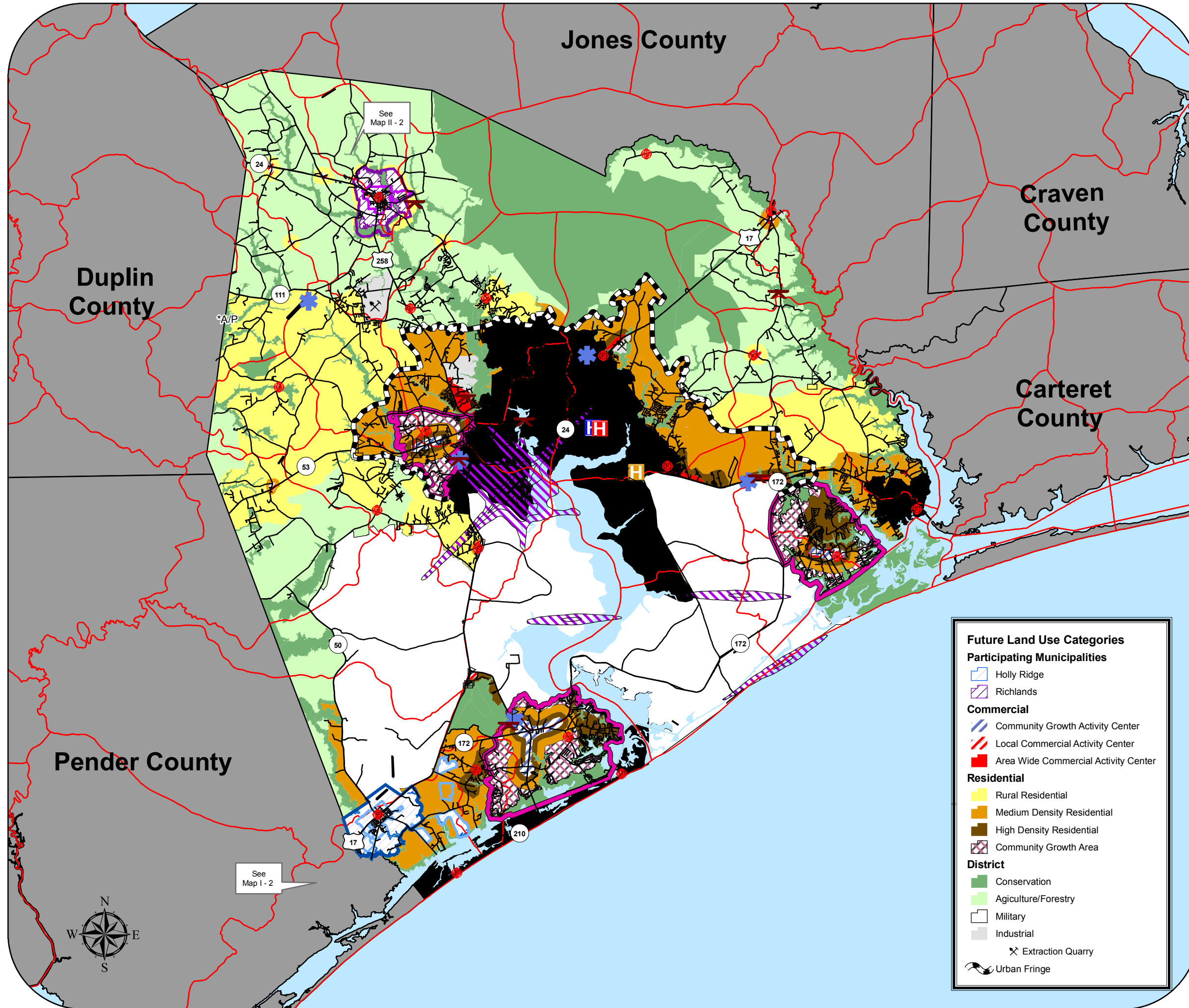

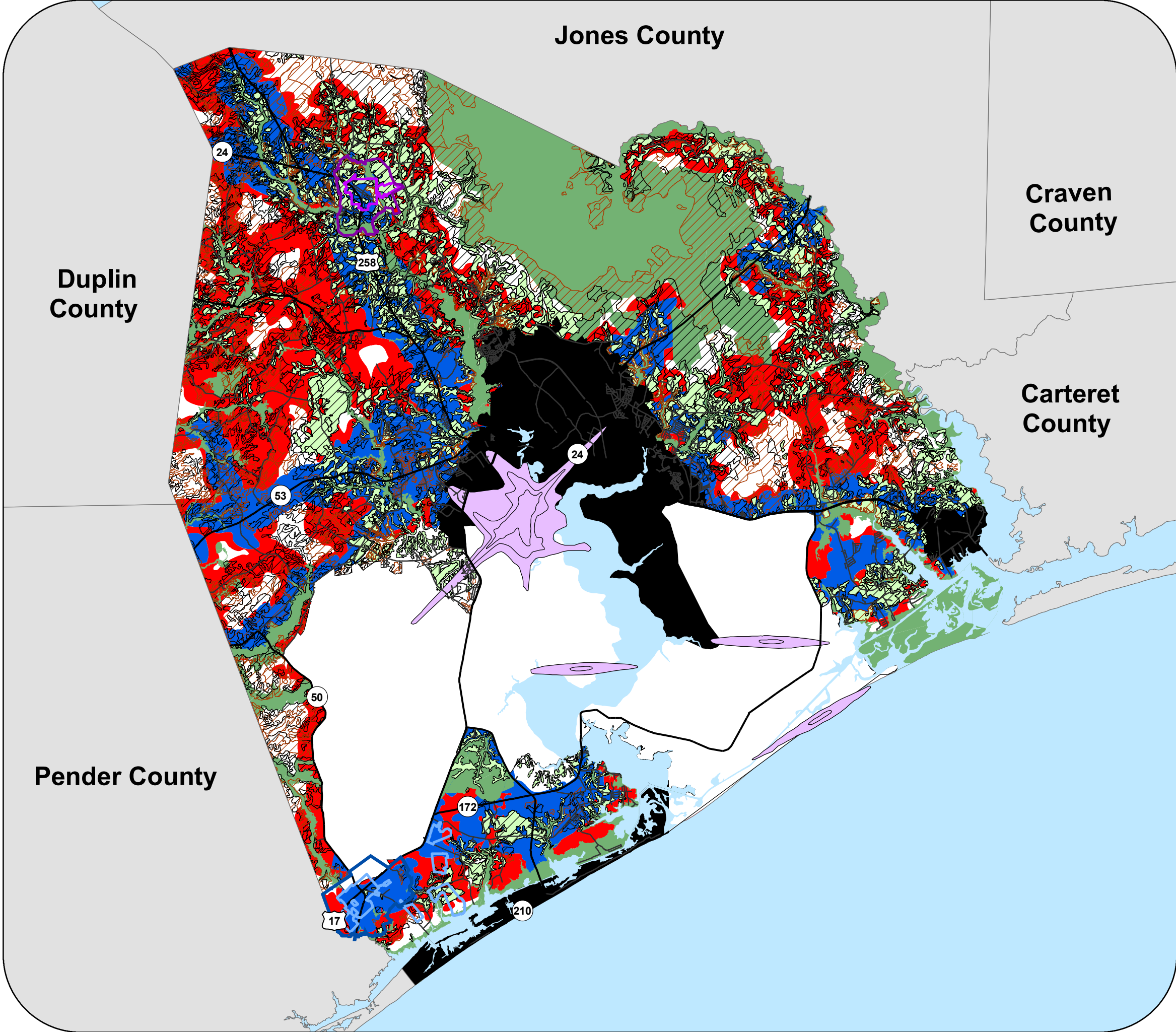

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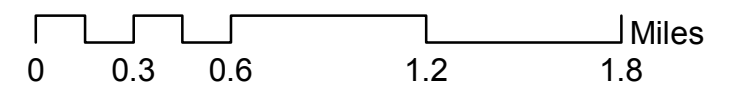

Holly Ridge Existing Land Use

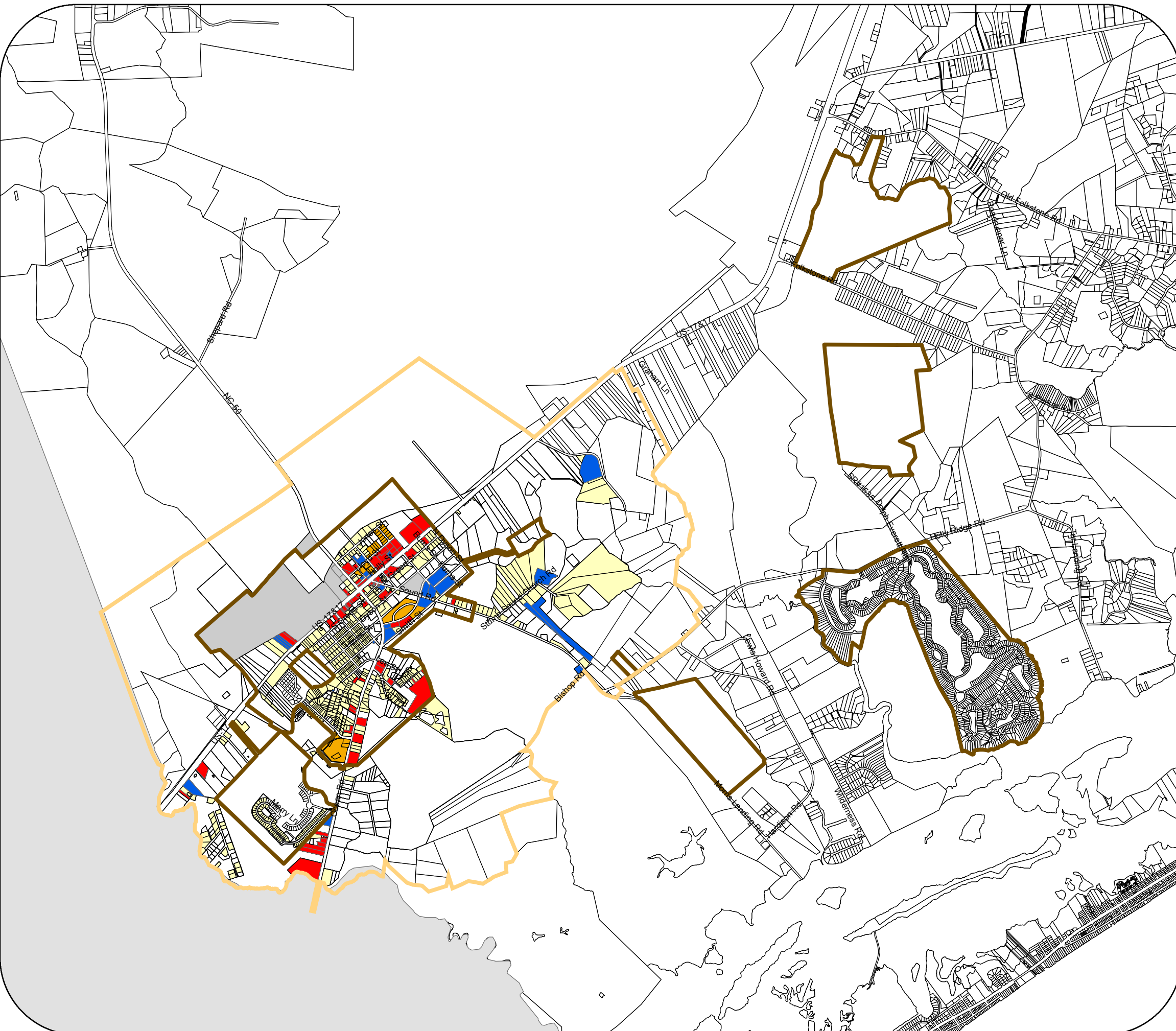

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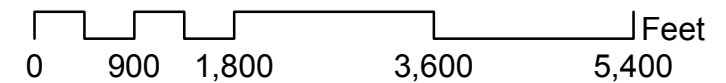

Richlands Existing Land Use

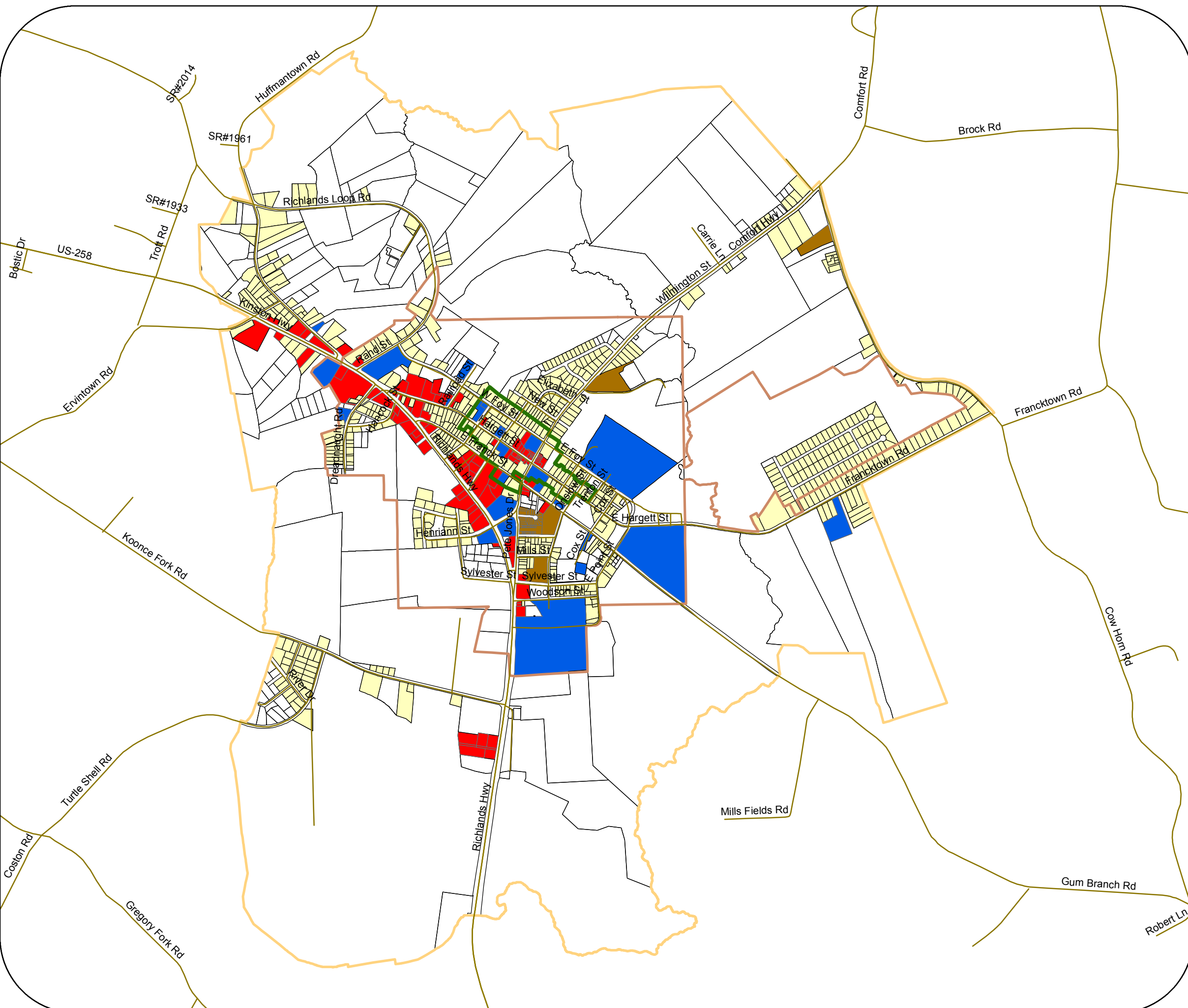

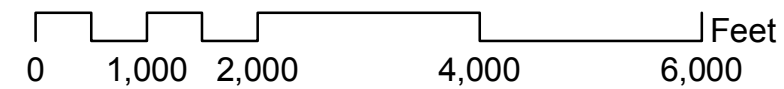
