The BB&T Site in Durham, North Carolina is the site of a former drycleaning business that operated from 1963 until 1975. Soil and groundwater at the site are contaminated with the dry*cleaning solvent tetrachloroethene* (also called "perc") and its breakdown products. The site is currently in the Dry-cleaning Solvent Cleanup Act (DSCA) **Program**, a voluntary program administered by the N. C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources that oversees the remediation of contaminated dry-cleaning sites.
