What is CFPUA?

- Created in 2007 by City of Wilmington, New Hanover County
- Took over water and wastewater systems from legacy government entities
- Opened its doors July 1, 2008. Employs approximately 290 people.
- Provide service to 67,000+ customer accounts. Nearly 200,000 people.



CFPUA: Providing Vital Services 24/7


We produce water, LIFE's most precious resource:

 - Overall Quality of Life




CFPUA: Providing Vital Services 24/7

- Your drinking water is a PRODUCT
 - Taken from Cape Fear River
 - Can't drink "AS IS"
 - Multiple stages of treatment
 - Filtration, disinfection
 - Pumped under pressure, stored
 - Available whenever you want it
 - All for .4 cents a gallon



CFPUA: Providing Vital Services 24/7

- Wastewater Treatment
 - Starts w/ reclaiming water
 via CFPUA's collection system
 - Ensures proper handling
 - Treated at wastewater treatment plants
 - Discharged back into the environment
 - All for .5 cents a gallon



HOW? CFPUA Facilities, Staff

CFPUA owns, operates and maintains systems that include:

- 2 Water Treatment Plants
- 2 Wastewater Treatment Plants
- ~2,000 MILES of water, sewer lines
- More than 7,700 fire hydrants
- Nearly 150 pump stations
- 11 elevated water tanks

Provide high-quality service in an environmentally responsible manner while maintaining the lowest practicable cost.

Supporting the Mission and Environmental Policy: High-quality Service

- CFPUA treats, distributes ~6 billion gallons of drinking water annually
 - Avg. 17 million+ gallons a day
- Collects, treats ~6 billion gallons of wastewater
 - Avg. 16 million+ gallons a day
- Nearly 80,000 CFPUA lab tests done annually to ensure quality
- Water quality awards for 9 straight years





Supporting the Mission and Environmental Policy: Maintaining Lowest Practicable Cost

- The Challenge: Maintaining responsible balance between system needs, fiscal and environmental sustainability
- Greater infrastructure needs in older areas. Costly, fewer new customers
- Right maintenance at right time
- CFPUA's Asset Management program
- "Find It, Fix It" program





Supporting the Mission and Environmental Policy: Environmental Responsibility

- ISO 14001:2015 Certified since April 2011 Fits Core Mission
 - Operations Utility Services
 - Collection System Maintenance
 - Pump Station Operations and Maintenance
 - Easement and Right of Way Maintenance
 - Construction and Water Distribution
 - Environmental Management Emergency Management, Laboratory Services, and Community Compliance
 - Engineering Development Services, Project Management, and Planning and Design

Supporting the Mission and Environmental Policy: Environmental Responsibility

- CFPUA Community Compliance staff
 - Fats, Oils, Grease (FOG) program
 - Conducts more than 1,000 inspections/year
 - Increases awareness. CEASE THE GREASE!
 - Assists restaurateurs in education
 - Leads "Cease the Grease" Lid Program
 - 40,000+ given away in last two years.
 - At least 400,000 ounces of grease kept out of our system





How CFPUA is Protecting Our Environment

- Preventative Cleaning programs
- CCTV Inspections
- Odor /Corrosion Chemical Program
- Easement and Right of Way Clearing
- Construction Crews available
- Optimizing Water and WW treatment









How we are doing:

- Over the last 5 years CFPUA has:
 - decreased the number of Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) by 52% and 77% drop in gallons spilled
- Beyond compliance with NPDES and PWS regulations
- Stay ahead of emerging issues
- Initiated an Authority wide recycling program in 2015:
 - 2015 recycled ~7,521 lbs of material
 - 2016 recycled over 7,600 lbs of material
 - 2016 400 lbs of gloves new stream























Where does ESI come in?

- It's not Mandatory why do it it's NCDEQ, why participate?
- The **REAL QUESTION** Should Be **WHY NOT Best ROI out there**?
- Compliance Assistance
 - Hazardous waste
 - Air Quality
- Challenges staff continual improvement think outside the box
 - Cease the Grease Pollution Prevention
 - Dumpster Dive 188 lbs total in dumpster and only 47.5 lbs actual trash
 - Spray Paint can recycling –(new stream) 69 cans were in dumpster
- Audit Assistance
 - 2015 Standard update review and audit
- Training Opportunities
 - Always learn something new Networking
