We contract through GFL and it is somewhat difficult to capture a true snap shot of associated cost. We have carts that are collected and we have a flucating number of homes so that cost goes up and down. We also provide town labor to collect bulk items and to collect 48 public town trash recps. this is disposed of in a 40 yard container on public works yard. capturing the cost of solid waste collection cost would be hard to calculate and only be an approximate. I feel the cost for disposal is close because all waste is taken by GFL and weighed with tickets. We also have a special waterfront district and we offer 1 a week and 2 a week pic ups of carts, then on top of that we have a compactor for business district and that volume can be calculated, again the collection fee for solid waste includes the pick up and delivery of container, we also offer 3 cardboard containers for business district that is not calculated on tonage but a simple flat rate fee. Also the business district recycling is a per container price and GFL does not tract tonage on this.

finally the yard debris is collected by town and collection cost is again hard to calculate and only an approximate. The volume is also approximate becasue the trucks are 1 ton dumps and if the debris in the back of the truck is not compacted down and or mulched up to fit the exact cubic yardage dimensions then the tonage will also be incorrect and only an approximate.
