Question #31 through Question # 36: No electronics funds received by the county: From the listing Electronics Management Fund Distribution list -DH -

Question # 43-Plastic Bottle Collection lower than last year: Changes occurred to this program during the fiscal year. Because of a change in recycling vendor, the county's materials travel more road miles. The result is that Hoke County has had to more stringently screen its plastics. It no longer allows food containers, hard to recycle plastics, and bulky plastics into the materials stream, which has resulted in lower tonnages. (Email sent by county staff -11/16/2019 -DH)

Question # 43 TVs and other electronics: Significantly lower over last year as a result of market pressure. The county no longer recycles electronics that are not specified under state law. The number of CRT TVs collected has significantly dropped and lighter more managable Flat Screen TVs have become more prevalent in the e-waste stream for Hoke County.
