**Annual Report on Animal Waste Management Permitting, Inspections and Compliance Activities**  
**July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024**

Per the requirements of General Statute (G.S.) 143-215.10M, the Department of Environmental Quality submits this annual report to the Environmental Review Commission and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Agriculture and Natural and Economic Resources, Fiscal Research Division. This report cover the statewide permitting, inspection and compliance activities of Animal Feeding Operation facilities for the period from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. This report also addresses the requirements of General Statute (G.S.) 143-215.10F and Session Law (S.L.) 1997-443 (and subsequent amendments).

G. S. 143-215.10F requires the N.C. Division of Water Resources (DWR) to inspect every permitted animal operation facility annually. As a result of S.L. 1997-443, the Division of Soil and Water Conservation (DSWC) began conducting operations reviews and routine compliance inspections<sup>1</sup> at animal operation facilities in Brunswick, Columbus, Jones and Pender counties under a pilot program. S.L. 2011-145 eliminated the requirement for DSWC to perform annual operations reviews. DSWC continues to perform routine compliance inspections in the four pilot counties under S.L. 2013-131 and S.L. 1997-443 and operations reviews and technical assistance and upon request. DWR conducts compliance inspections at all other animal operation facilities located outside of the pilot counties.

The tables in this report summarize the number and type of inspections performed by DWR and DSWC, the number of violations identified during inspections, the number of enforcement actions initiated, and the number of permits issued from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 (reporting period).

Statewide, DWR and DSWC conducted 2,146 compliance inspections and operation reviews at animal operation facilities during this reporting period. DWR conducts inspections on a calendar year basis, and therefore this summary - done by fiscal year - may not represent all inspections performed in a calendar year. In addition, some facilities were inspected multiple times. Routine compliance inspections were conducted at more than 87 percent of all permitted animal operation facilities during this reporting period.

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<sup>1</sup> *Operations reviews* and *compliance inspections* are both conducted for the purpose of determining whether the animal operation system is causing a violation of water quality standards and whether the system is in compliance with its animal waste management plan or any other condition of the permit. *Operations reviews* are conducted by the Division of Soil and Water Conservation exclusively.

Table 2 presents the number of animal permits issued by DWR in FY 2023-24 arranged by regional office. This number includes new projects, as well as any modifications made to existing permits including renewal of Individual Permits. Approximately 2,202 farms are covered under State and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits. All permits for animal operations must be renewed every five years. The renewal for the NPDES general permit took place in 2022.

There were 121 violations recorded in FY 2023-2024 which accounts for approximately 5.6 percent of the total 2,146 inspections completed (Table 4). Inadequate freeboard, unpermitted discharges and over application were the most common violations and deficiencies (Tables 4 – 6). Cattle and swine facilities had the highest number of violations and deficiencies among the types of animal operations (Table 6).
