What: Rules Advisory Team (RAT): Purpose

- Division of Marine Fisheries rules team
- Manages activities for Marine Fisheries Commission rulemaking
- Assists with implementing rules
- Reviews legislative items
- Develops issue papers
- Many reasons to propose rule changes
- Rules proposed for "amendment", "adoption", or "repeal"






Why: RAT Mini-Orientation: Timing

- 2017: Periodic Review and Expiration of Existing Rules:
 - 1. Report (complete)
 - 2. Readoption (full rulemaking process)
- 2017-2021:
 - About 300 rules addressed
 - Only 80 rules remaining
- Dec. 8, 2021: Resume regular RAT activities



How: RAT Operation

- Membership updated

Who: RAT and other Rulemaking Entities

- North Carolina General Assembly (NCGA)
 - ✓ Enacts laws
- Marine Fisheries Commission (MFC)
 - √ Adopts rules
- Division of Marine Fisheries (DMF)
 - ✓ Rules Advisory Team (RAT) develops and implements rules






Who: RAT and other Rulemaking Entities

- Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM)
 - ✓ Fiscal analysis of rules
- Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH)
 - ✓ Maintains N.C. Administrative Code (NCAC)
- Rules Review Commission (RRC)
 - ✓ Final approval of rules




When: Rulemaking Cycles and Time Tables

- Annual rulemaking cycle
- Start: May Marine Fisheries Commission meeting
- End: April 1 intended effective date
- Prepare issue papers the year before the start
- One to three years for a rule to become effective
- Rulebook or supplement published with new rules



Where: Rulemaking Resources



- Division shared drive > Rules Advisory Team
 - Current rulebook (April 1, 2020)
 - Current supplement (May 1, 2021)
 - Issue paper template
 - Guides with rulemaking standards
- NCGA (laws) > ncleg.gov
- NCAC (rules) > oah.nc.gov
- DMF (proclamations) > deq.nc.gov


