This application is to be completed and signed by individuals applying for a Recreational Commercial Gear license. Individuals applying for a license for another under the authority of Power of Attorney must submit a **PHOTOCOPY** of the Power of Attorney and current picture identification.

Provide a **PHOTOCOPY** of one of the following current picture identifications:

- Driver's License; or
- State Identification (issued by DMV); or
- Military Identification; or

- · Passport; or
- Resident Alien Card (green card)

### A Recreational Commercial Gear License Application:

- If you have moved to the state of North Carolina and have resided within the state for 60 days to six months and consider North Carolina as your permanent residence, you are required to complete the Certification of Eligibility for North Carolina Residency/Domicile.
- Sign and date the RCGL application.
- If you set a non-exempt gill net (anchored gill nets) with this license you will also need to fill out the EGNP application and sign, date, and notarize (new applications only), the Permit Application Certification & General Permit Conditions Form and sign, date, and notarize (new applications only), and the Estuarine Gill Net Permit Specific Conditions Form. Mail all forms back with application(s) and current pictured identification.
- Check corresponding box on application for use of non-exempt gill nets (anchored gill nets).
  - o An EGNP is required for gill-net fisheries that are covered by the ITP. Previously, the ITP, EGNP, and other related DMF documents used the term "anchored gill nets", while fisheries exempt from these requirements were termed run-around, strike, or drop gill nets and drift gill nets. With the new ITP, definitions of exempted gill-net fisheries were updated. The revised definitions offer greater consistency with the description of gear in the ITP application, and are as follows:
    - Run-around, strike, or drop gill nets: gill nets that are actively fished by either (1) using the boat to run a net around a school of fish, creating a closed circle, or (2) using the boat after the net is set to herd fish into the net without delay, whereby soak time does not exceed 30 minutes from the end of the set to the beginning of the haul.
    - <u>Drift gill nets</u>: gill nets that are used to capture fish while being moved along by water currents whereby the net stays attached to the vessel from deployment through retrieval.

Non-exempt gill nets are those that do not meet these definitions, and the term "non-exempt" replaces the previously used description of "anchored". As such, they are regulated, in part, by the EGNP.

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### For those individuals applying for a Recreational Commercial Gear license (RCGL):

As of June 2023, an Estuarine Gill Net Permit will be required for anyone who plans to fish non-exempt gill nets (anchored gill nets) in estuarine waters. This includes the sounds and rivers, but not the ocean. Non-exempt gill nets (anchored gill nets), also known as fixed or stationary gill nets, are defined as nets anchored or staked to the bottom, or some structure attached to the bottom, on both ends. To ensure compliance with the Federally issued Incidental Take Permits for sea turtles and sturgeon in the estuarine anchored gill net fishery, a condition of this permit is that the fisher agrees to be observed by the DMF's Observer Program.

To help schedule these observed fishing trips, the DMF developed a "call-in system" called the Observer Trip Scheduling System (**OTSS**) that EGNP holders will have to use if they plan on fishing non-exempt gill nets (anchored gill nets) in the sounds and rivers for a given week.

If the fisher ONLY fishes drift, runaround, strike, and/or drop gill nets and NOT non-exempt gill nets (anchored gill nets) (set, fixed, stationary), then they do not need an EGNP. Drift nets are defined as nets used to capture fish while being moved along by water current and the net is being actively fished and attended from deployment through retrieval, and runaround nets, including strike and drop nets are defined as nets that are set and then immediately retrieved.

The Observer Trip Scheduling System (OTSS) is live as of February 2025. Fishermen will use either a call in system (833-487-8747 or 833-ITP-TRIP) or a web portal (https://dmf.ncdenr.org/OTSSPublic/) to submit plans to fish for the following week. Fishermen will be required to use the system to declare their fishing plans for the following week (E.g. Report in 2/17-2/19 for their intent to fish 2/24-3/2). All Estuarine Gill Net Permit (EGNP) holders who intend to fish non-exempted gill nets will be required to use this system in order to fish.

The system has a weekly schedule of contacts. On Mondays and Wednesdays, fishermen who hold a current product year EGNP will receive reminders to use OTSS to declare their fishing plans. They will receive these reminders through a phone call, text, and email. On Thursday, selections will occur that will determine whether the fisherman will be selected to be observed by Observer Program or FM staff. After selections have been made, the OTSS will notify fishermen using the same opt in settings that the reminders use. There needs to be at least one opt in checked so that fishermen are receiving their selection message.

## North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality Division of Marine Fisheries ESTUARINE GILL NET PERMIT APPLICATION (REV 2024-12)

An Estuarine Gill Net Permit is required for anyone setting anchored gill nets in estuarine Internal Joint and Coastal (estuarine) waters that are covered by the Division of Marine Fisheries Incidental Take Permit issued by National Marine Fisheries Service under Section 10 of the Endangered Species Act. This requirement applies to gill nets used beginning September 1, 2014, whether for commercial or recreational purposes except gill nets that are exempted from the Incidental Take Permit defined as follows.

- Run-around, strike, or drop gill nets: gill nets that are actively fished by either (1) using the boat to run a net around a school of fish, creating a closed circle, or (2) using the boat after the net is set to herd fish into the net without delay, whereby soak time does not exceed 30 minutes from the end of the set to the beginning of the haul.
- <u>Drift gill nets</u>: gill nets that are used to capture fish while being moved along by water currents whereby the net stays attached to the vessel from deployment through retrieval.

The permit is free of charge. The application is available at any division license office, on our website, or by calling a division office and requesting an application. Refer to proclamation number M-2-2025 and the attached list of Frequently Asked Questions for more information.

The Estuarine Gill Net Permit (EGNP) serves as a certificate of your inclusion in the Incidental Take Permit Conservation Plan.

The Division of Marine Fisheries has received a new Federal Endangered Species Action Section 10 Incidental Take Permit (ITP; Number 27106) from the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) authorizing a limited number of incidental takes of threatened or endangered sea turtles, and endangered sturgeon in estuarine gill net fisheries with the exceptions of runaround/strike/drop and drift gill nets as described below:

- 1. Runaround, strike or drop gill nets gill nets that are actively fished by either (1) using the boat to run a net around a school of fish, creating a closed circle, or (2) using the boat after the net is set to herd fish into the net without delay, whereby soak time does not exceed 30 minutes from the end of the set to the beginning of the haul.
- 2. Drift gill nets gill nets that are used to capture fish while being moved along by water currents whereby the net stays attached to the vessel from deployment though retrieval.

The EGNP meets related permit requirements of the Incidental Take Permit (15A NCAC 03H .0103(a), 03O .0506). The ITP includes a Conservation Plan that outlines measures to monitor, avoid & minimize, and mitigate interactions with these species in gill-net fisheries covered by the ITP. As part of the Conservation Plan, fishermen must apply for and receive an EGNP in order to use commercial or recreational gill nets covered by the ITP.

The Fisheries Director may, by proclamation, require individuals taking marine and estuarine resources regulated by the Marine Fisheries Commission, to obtain a special permit.

For violation of specific permit conditions (as specified on this form), permits may be suspended or revoked in accordance with 15A NCAC 03O .0504.

#### **Legal Authority:**

Authority for Estuarine Gill Net Permit is specified in G.S. 113-169.1, G.S. 113-221.1, 15A NCAC 03O .0501, 03O .0502, and 03O .0506.

### **Specific Permit Conditions:**

An EGNP is required for holders of a Standard Commercial Fishing License (SCFL), Retired Standard Commercial Fishing License (RSCFL), or Recreational Commercial Gear License (RCGL) who deploy gill nets in Internal Coastal Waters and Joint Waters, except as described above for runaround/strike/drop or drift gills nets. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

Permits are non-transferable (see General Permit conditions). An individual who is assigned a SCFL shall hold an EGNP in their own name. The master designated on the single vessel corporation SCFL is the individual eligible to receive the EGNP.

15A NCAC 03O .0502(a) (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

EGNP holders whose permit has been suspended or revoked shall contact the Division of Marine Fisheries Protected Resources staff at (252) 515-5625 or (252) 515-5624 within 5 calendar days of reinstatement of the EGNP to arrange an observer trip. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful to violate the provisions of any rules or proclamations issued in regards to the conditions set out in the federally issued ESA Section 10 Incidental Take Permit to reduce incidental takes of sea turtles and sturgeon in large- or small-mesh gill-net fisheries covered by the ITP. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful for an EGNP holder to refuse or deny Division of Marine Fisheries observers a trip aboard their vessel to collect data or a trip using alternative platform to collect data. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful for an EGNP holder, as well as the master and crew members of the boat, to interfere with, or obstruct the observer in the course of collecting data or samples, which shall include refusal or failure to provide information on fishing gear parameters or to provide any captured finfish or sea turtle to Division of Marine Fisheries staff. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful for an EGNP holder, as well as the master and crew members of the boat, to harass the observer in the course of setting up trips, collecting data and samples, or during any other type of communication. Harassment shall be defined consistent with the federal regulations, 50 CFR §600.725(o), (t), and (u), and may be verbal or physical including, but not limited to, sexual connotations, intimidating, resisting, impeding, threatening, bribing, and coercion of observers. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(b)(1)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful for an EGNP holder to avoid or mislead observers including but not limited to failure to return phone calls (regardless of whether or not the EGNP holder is actively fishing or not), failure to notify the Division of Marine Fisheries of a phone number change within 14 calendar days of such change and providing incorrect information on fishing activity. **15A NCAC 03O.0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O.0506)

It is unlawful to fail to provide a phone number that the EGNP holder can be reached. 15A NCAC 03O .0502(a) (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

When the Division of Marine Fisheries determines an EGNP holder's boat does not meet the safety requirements to carry an observer, the EGNP holder will be notified and shall contact the Division of Marine Fisheries Protected Resources staff at (252) 515-5625 or (252) 515-5624 within 5 calendar days to make arrangements for an alternative platform observer trip. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful to fail to comply with all observer notification system or call-in requirements set out by permit conditions, proclamations, and/or rule. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)

It is unlawful to fail to report within 24 hours of capture any sea turtle or sturgeon captured in gill-net fisheries covered by the federally issued ESA Section 10 Incidental Take Permit. Reports shall be made to the Division of Marine Fisheries at (252) 515-5500 or (800) 682-2632. Permit holders must follow instructions for safe handling, resuscitation, and disposition for any incidentally captured sea turtles or sturgeon provided to EGNP holders at the time they receive their permit. Self-reported takes of sea turtles and sturgeon by fishermen fishing without an observer do not count toward the allowable takes in the Incidental Take Permit. **15A NCAC 03O .0502(a)** (15A NCAC 03O .0506)
