Coastal Habitat Protection Plan

Origin

- Mandated by Fisheries Reform Act (G.S. 143B-279.8)
- Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to draft the plan
- Environmental Management (EMC), Coastal Resources (CRC), and Marine Fisheries (MFC) commissions must approve and <u>implement plan recommendations</u>

Purpose

 Long-term enhancement of coastal fisheries by addressing habitat and water quality needs of fishery species
