

Waste (Solid)

Incinerator Permit

What Activities Require This Permit? The construction and operation of a solid waste management facility for the acceptance and incineration of solid waste as defined in North Carolina General Statute 130A or North Carolina Administrative Code Title 15A Subchapter 13B.

What Is The Purpose of This Permit? To ensure the site, construction and operation of solid waste management facilities meet all applicable federal and state regulatory requirements.

Who Issues This Permit? N.C. Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section – Permitting Branch.

Please do not send fee with application. The Solid Waste Section will send an invoice for the application fee once the application is received and accepted. How Long Will It Take To Review My Application? As indicated in North Carolina General Statute 130A-295.8(e), the division will make a determination on completeness within 90 days of receipt of the application. The division shall issue a draft permit decision on an application for a permit within one year after the division determines that the application is complete.

Where Do I Submit My Application? One (1) electronic copy of the application should be emailed to the appropriate [Permitting Engineer](#) or to Sherri.Stanley@deq.nc.gov. If requested by the Section, a hard copy of the application or of the associated drawings can be mailed to N.C. Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section – Permitting Branch, 1646 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-1646.

How Long Is My Permit or License or Certificate Valid? The permit to operate the facility is valid for five years.

Notes/Comments: All engineering plans and specifications submitted for approval must be prepared by a North Carolina registered professional engineer.
