PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY SECTION

The PWSS regulates public water systems within the state. Public water systems are those which provide piped drinking water to at least 15 connections or 25 or more people 60 or more days per year. The PWS section works with public water systems to ensure the water supply is safe to drink. This is accomplished through inspections, source site approval, investigations, plans and specification reviews, operating report reviews, providing emergency response to water systems, and by providing technical assistance to water system personnel, consultants and operators.


