Install a new 3,200 LF, 12-inch finished water transmission main including crossing the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway (AIWC) by directional drilling to create a redundant connection between the

mainland and island area of the system

Replace approximately 2,860 LF of 4-inch diameter water main with 8-inch DR14 C-900 PVC water main along North Shore Drive

The above-named applicant will receive funding assistance from the State Revolving Fund. The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Water Infrastructure (**Division**) has conducted a review of the project in accordance with the NCGS §159G-38. The Division has determined that this project is below the minor construction activities threshold outlined in the 15A NCAC 01C .0408; therefore, the project is exempt from inter-agency review, and the preparation of additional environmental documents is not required.
