

Water Resources Development Grant Program - Flood Resiliency Grants

## **Questions & Answers**

Below are anticipated questions and answers associated with our Flood Resiliency Grants that are currently available during our Spring 2025 application cycle. These grants are a sub-component of the State & Local Projects portion of the Water Resources Development Grant Program (WRDG).

**Is this a one-time or recurring funding opportunity?** Yes this is <u>currently</u> considered a one-time funding opportunity and not a recurring funding program like our State & Local Projects. Applications will be received from now until June 30, 2025.

**Who is eligible to apply?** Units of local government and local political subdivisions (County, City, Town or regional <u>Council of Governments</u>). Non-governmental organizations such as a non-profit, private consultant, university or watershed association can serve as a primary contact or supporter and help administer the grant on behalf of the local government.

**What types of projects will be given priority?** Projects must be located within the Cape Fear, French Broad, Lumber, Neuse, Tar Pamlico & White Oak <u>river basins</u>. Priority will be given to shovel-ready projects that provide the most significant flood reduction or flood resiliency benefits. Will there be a funding request limit or a funding range requested not to exceed? No, there will not be a 'recommended funding request not to exceed' as there is for our State & Local Projects. However funding would be limited based on available funding at the time we receive a completed application submittal and the number of applications received that are closest to shovel ready.

What Is The Matching Funds Requirement? The WRDG can provide up to  $66^{2/3}$  percent (66.67) of cost-share funding for <u>nonfederal construction costs</u> and the applicant/grantee is responsible for providing  $33^{1/3}$  percent (33.33) of <u>nonfederal construction costs</u>.

**How long will the grant application review and award notification process take?** Once received applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis and at least quarterly through June 30, 2025. It generally takes less than one month for a DEQ contract to be executed once all of the required documentation has been received.

If a project is recommended for funding what is the timeline in which funds need to be fully spent and the project completed? Projects need to be completed within 2-3 years after DEQ contract execution. The WRDG allows for project expenses for work conducted after the application submittal but prior to contract execution to be counted as a matching contribution. Project expenses for work associated with grant reimbursement cannot begin and be reimbursed until after contract execution.
