SS notes about electronics from Angel White: Originally reported 17.19 tons electronics (no TV breakout). Updated #s per eCycle Secure reports, which total 11.57 tons. This is because "The originally reported numbers includes EVERYTHING that comes in on our electronics trailers from the convenience sites... so sometimes included in those tonnages are items that are not actually electronics. After the trailers are weighed in at the landfill we sort the items and put them in the correct area. Well-meaning community members will put dishwashers, TV cabinets (without the TV), and all kinds of stuff into the electronics trailer that don't actually end up going to eCycle. It may be better to use the tonnages reported from eCycle for an accurate report."
