

Clean Water Act Section 205(j) Grant North Carolina



2019 Grant Projects

Montreat Stormwater Inventory and Management Plan (\$28,685)

Land of Sky Regional Council partnered with Blue Earth, Town of Montreat and the Montreat College to inventory and map the Town's existing stormwater system and to develop a stormwater management plan that will focus on steep slopes and limited right-of-way to reduce erosion and sedimentation.

Winklers Creek Stormwater & Restoration Plan (\$20,000)

High Country Council of Governments worked with local stakeholders to identify, design and prioritize stormwater improvement projects in a heavily developed area of Boone to address severe erosion and water quality concerns.

Richland Creek Watershed Plan (\$19,660)

Piedmont Triad Regional Council worked with the City of High Point, Southwest Renewal Foundation of High Point, and Guilford County Soil & Water Conservation District to develop a 9-Element watershed plan for Richland Creek to restore water quality conditions.

Atlantic Beach Nine Minimum Element Watershed Restoration and Stormwater Resiliency Plan (\$29,759)

The Eastern Carolina Council, Town of Atlantic Beach, LDSI, and North Carolina Coastal Federation collaborated to develop a 9-Element watershed restoration plan to reduce water pollution in Atlantic Beach.

Integrated Watershed and Nutrient Management for the Jordan Lake Watershed (\$96,923)

Triangle J Council of Governments partnered with Piedmont Triad Regional Council to continue nutrient management efforts for the Jordan Lake One Water initiative.

Riparian buffer educational resources for local programs (\$26,271)

NC State University partnered with NC Division of Water Resources to develop a buffer rules outreach program to improve awareness and implementation of the state's riparian buffer rules.
