White Goods Volume: Our White Goods total is not 357 tons. Our vendor was only able to provide 357 total tons of TOTAL metal recovered from our facility for the last fiscal year. White goods were included but they were unable to provide a specific volume. Single Stream Recycling tonnage is 452.54. Tire tonnage was 515.42. This includes all tires received (certified commercial and residential) at the Yadkin County Solid Waste Facility. This also includes significant amount of agricultural tires.

The cost of recycling has drastically increased our operating costs. We had to account for a price increase of over 200% with a new RFP for collections.

Tonnage has significantly increased since COVID19, however we have not seen increased revenues. We have increased collections drastically from sites due to the volume of household solid waste we are experiencing.
